Access Information

Physical Access

The venue is wheelchair accessible.

There is level access to most spaces.

Two workshop spaces are reached by a ramp.

British Sign Language (BSL)

BSL interpreters will be at the event.

Live Captions

Live captions will be provided during talks and panels.

Quiet Space

There will be a quiet sensory breakout space.

You can use this space whenever you need to.

Gardens

Accessible gardens are available throughout the day.

Air Filters

HEPA air filters will be used in the main event spaces.



The Venue

Ham Green House is a large historic house near Bristol.

It is surrounded by gardens.

The venue is calm and peaceful.

Today it is used by Penny Brohn UK, a charity supporting wellbeing and health.



Getting There

Ham Green House is close to Bristol.

It is near Junction 19 of the M5 motorway.
